About the Fund

P.S. You Are Here (PSYAH) is a creative placemaking program supporting short-term, collaborative, and community-led projects that engage the public to transform Denver's outdoor public spaces. PSYAH projects build civic engagement, bring vibrancy to Denver's neighborhoods, honor heritage, beautify outdoor space, and enrich communities.

Public space is defined as an area that is accessible and open to everyone, including but not limited to alleys, parks, plazas, facilities, streets, and other outdoor, civic spaces. These spaces are owned and maintained by the City and County of Denver, as opposed to private property. Examples include public parks, community or recreation centers, public rights-of-way.

City Benefit & Impact

We are dedicated to creating a process that is truly equitable and reflects the full spectrum of people, disciplines, impact areas, audiences, and council districts across Denver.

Project Management

The grantee will coordinate marketing, planning, permitting, installation, maintenance, and de-installation of the project. We have several resources and can connect you with city representatives to help implement your project. The grantee should keep the PSYAH Program Managers updated on the progress of the project, and any support they need along the way. DAV asks that grantees keep us informed on the progress of the program or project, and communicate any updates, changes, or support needs that may arise related to budget, timeline, planning, staffing or otherwise.

Orientation and Payment

- Grantees will work with DAV and the DAV Fiscal Administrator, RedLine Contemporary Art Center, to provide information necessary for disbursement of funds, including a W-9.
- Grantees will participate in an orientation meeting with DAV to kick off the grant implementation phase and will communicate with the PSYAH Program Managers regarding key project milestones, implementation timeline, challenges, or questions.

Program Implementation

- Projects must take place within the City and County of Denver
- Projects should take place between January - December 2026
- The project must have an identified project lead who will implement and track the impact of the program.
- If the project is significantly changed (e.g. project description, event location/s and frequency, target audience, budget, etc.) grantee must contact the PSYAH Program Managers to discuss these updates. Please note: if the changes affect eligibility, the grantee may be required to return the funds.
- When applicable, grantees are asked to include DAV staff in programs and events supported by this grant.

Conceptual Design and Execution of the Project

The grantee has submitted an initial proposal and conceptual design for their project. The final project should be appropriate to a public setting and for viewing by the public of all ages visiting the site. Before installation, the grantee should get approval of the final design from the DAV Program Manager. Prior to, during, and after installation of the project, the grantee may be required to revise the project to comply with City regulations.

Display Period

The project is intended to be temporary from 3 months for up to one year and shall be de-installed at such time and in the manner required by the DAV PSYAH Program Managers. Please contact the PSYAH Program Managers with any questions, or changes in installation time or planning.

Maintenance and Repair

The grantee shall be responsible for any maintenance or repair of the project; provided, however, that any maintenance or repair work shall be coordinated with and done in accordance with the requirements of the PSYAH Program Managers.

De-installation

The grantee understands and agrees that the project is intended to be temporary and will be de-conclusion of the display period.

Marketing

The DAV team can support and elevate the grantee's marketing efforts as space allows on our social media platforms, newsletter, and website calendar.

Please fill out this [Marketing Support Form](#) at least 30-60 days in advance to supply the necessary information to our marketing team.

Through this funding, the grantee has the rights to non-exclusive use of DAV name and logos for marketing collateral, media and online promotion upon written approval for each use.

DAV asks that the grantee include reference of the DAV underwriting partnership along with the DAV logo on websites, press releases, social media, print and written materials related to funding projects or programs along with this phrase: *"This program is supported by Denver Arts & Venues through the P.S You Are Here Fund."*

DAV supports each grantee and program in unique ways, tailoring marketing efforts are based on available resources, opportunities, timelines, space limitations, and alignment with organizational goals. While DAV aims to highlight all partners meaningfully, the type and amount of promotion may differ across programs and grantees.

Insurance

Grantee should consider whether a project or program may need the following insurance:

- Workers' Compensation - State mandated coverage for employees injured on the job. Colorado Workers' Compensation law requires any business with one or more employees to carry this type of insurance. Sole Proprietors (those with no employees) are not required to carry Workers' Compensation.
- Business Auto Liability - Coverage for liability claims by a third party related to the operation of an automobile.
- General Liability - Coverage for liability claims by a third party related to bodily injury (injury to another person) or property damage (damage to another person's property). Limits will vary depending on the scope of work.

Compliance with Patent, Trademark and Copyright Laws

Grantee agrees that all work performed shall comply with all applicable patent, trademark and copyright laws, rules, regulations and codes of the United States. Vendor further agrees that it will not utilize any protected patent, trademark or copyright in performance of its work unless the Vendor has obtained proper permission and all releases and other necessary documents. If the Grantee specifies any material, equipment, process or procedure, which is protected, the Grantee shall disclose such patents, trademarks and copyrights in the construction drawings or technical specifications. Grantee agrees to release, indemnify and save harmless the City, its officers, agents and employees, from any and all claims, damages, suits, costs, expenses, liabilities, actions or proceedings of any kind or nature whatsoever, of or by anyone whomsoever, in any way resulting from, or arising out of, directly or indirectly, the performance or work under this agreement which infringes upon any patent, trademark or copyright protected by law.

Indemnification

In addition to the other indemnification requirements, the Grantee will further indemnify, defend and hold the City harmless from and against any claims, losses, damages, liabilities or expenses (including reasonable attorneys' fees and expenses) arising out of or resulting from any third party claim that the Project, when used by City in accordance with this Agreement, infringes, misappropriates or violates any United States patent issued as of the date hereof, copyright, trademark, trade secret or other intellectual or proprietary right of any third party. If an injunction or order is obtained against the City's use of the Project by reason of a claim of the type described above, or if in Grantees opinion, the Project is likely to become the subject of such a claim, Vendor shall take all necessary action to correct any such infringement or misappropriation to give the City the right to continue using the Project.

Reporting

Grantees must submit a P.S. You Are Here Wrap-Up Document (provided by DAV staff) and all related materials within 60 days after the program ends. DAV is interested in learning about the program's successes, challenges, engagement process, partners, final budget breakdown, participant demographics, and any photos, videos, testimonials, and media coverage that may be shared.

Non-compliance Reimbursement

The grantee must promptly reimburse the City and County of Denver if the program is out of compliance with any aspect of the grant guidelines and agreement.
